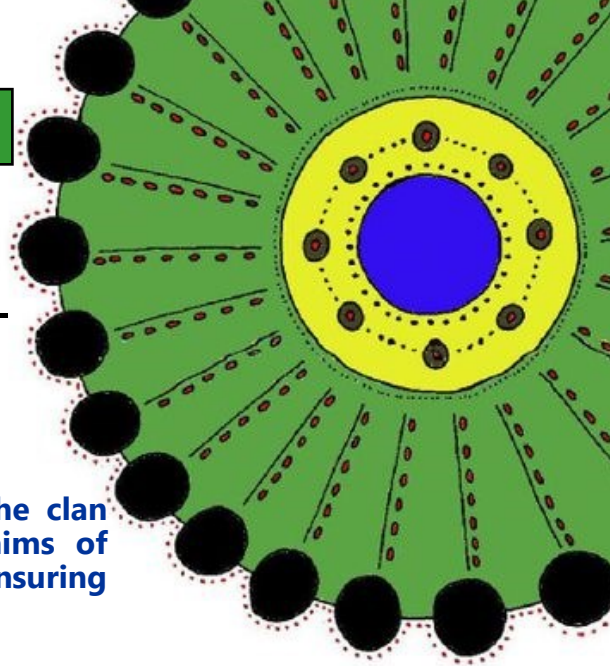

### Getting Ready for Flu Season

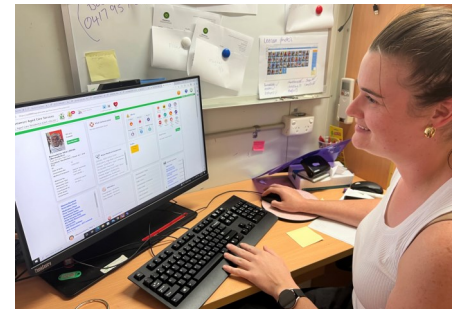


The Health Clinic is running its flu vaccination drive from next Monday through until next Wednesday. They will have vaccination stations set up at all the usual
