Tropical Oyster Conference

Black-lip rock oysters are a species of rock oyster found across the northern Australia coast. NTG Fisheries have been investigating them as an opportunity for aquaculture businesses in partnership with remote Aboriginal communities and have established trial sites on the South Goulburn Island and more recently on the Tiwi islands.



The Traditional Owners of Dorchety Island and Old Mission, (country on the North coastal tip of Wadeye), are embarking on a trial to establish both subtidal and intertidal oyster grow out farms in the coastal waters of Dorchety Island.



The TO's , along with some of the Rangers, attended the Tropical Oyster Conference on Sunday and Monday , to learn from the experience of previous trials and to plan for a local trial.



There is real potential for family-owned enterprises, and employment opportunities that align with aspirations of working on country and using natural resources , and we are all very excited to start the trials.
