Da Ngimalmin Official Opening



Tobias Gives Heartfelt Speech



Tobias Nganbe gave a heartfelt speech at the opening on Monday, telling the story of Da Ngimalmin, meaning the roots of everything, and how strong roots grow strong branches, and strong trees. This story depicts the importance of strong beginnings to build strong families.

The Da Ngimalmin journey has been a long one for Tobias. It started in 2007 when he was Co-Principal of the local school and challenged the Federal Government, through the Human Rights Commission on the underinvestment into education in Wadeye. He argued the community had been the victim of racial discrimination because its school has been underfunded for 30 years.

In 2012, as a result of the challenge, \$7.7 was pledged to improve education for children and families. The Da Ngimalmin child and family centre is the result of some of that funding.
