NT EMERGENCY SERVICES VOLUNTEERS (NTES)


Wadeye Police and the community are seeking to get the local NTES back up and running.

How good was it to see Scotty R back in town, and with all his hair! Scott was in town to assess the sound equipment which sadly has been badly damaged.


