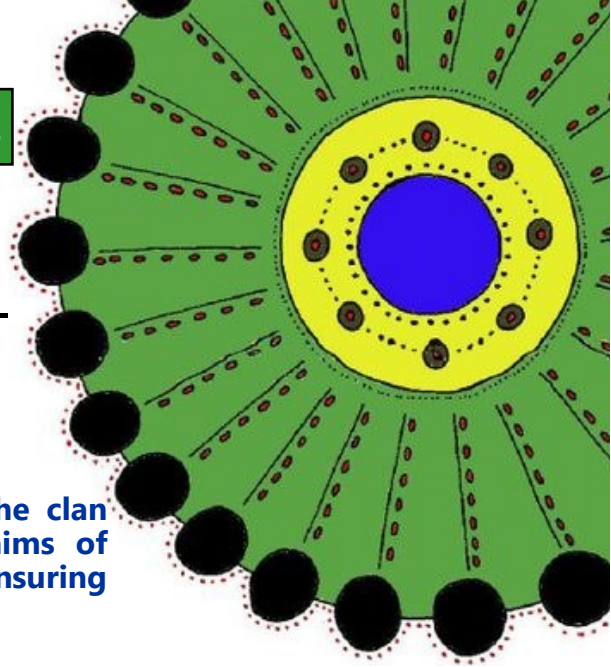

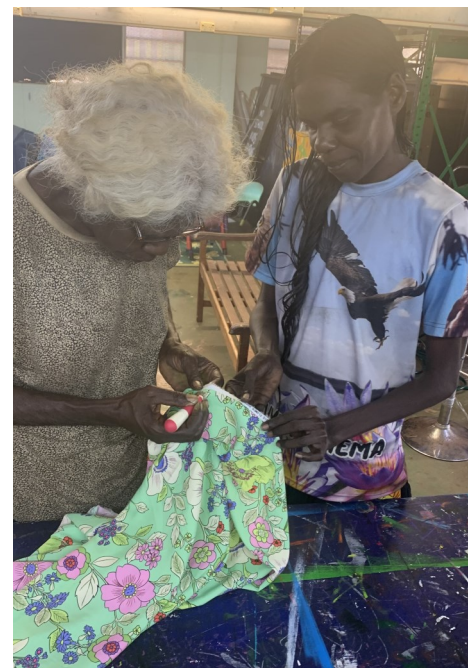


Women Sewing Market Wares

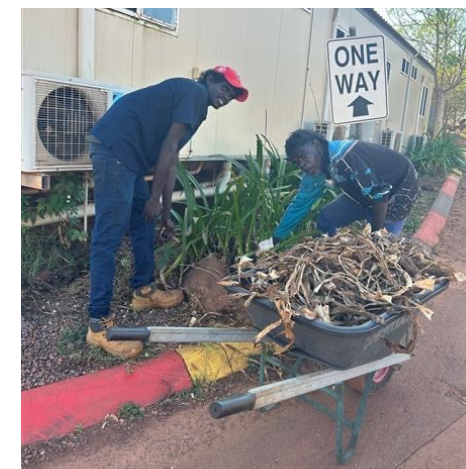
Rob has worked hard to get the Men's Shed and its equipment up to WHS standards, and to make it more accessible to participants with disabilities.
