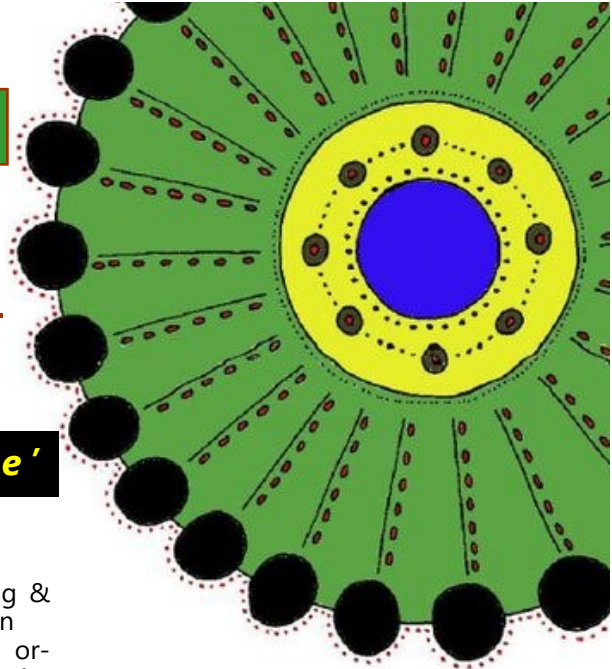

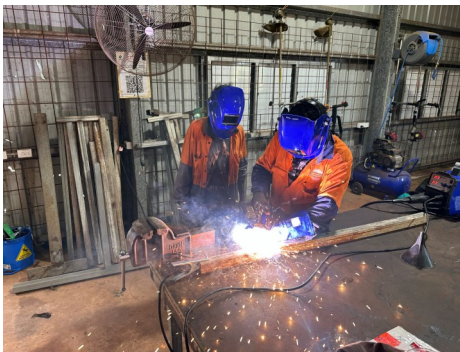

### CHANGES TO LIQUOR PERMITS

The NTG Senior Director of Liquor Licensing & Compliance issued a letter on Friday the 23rd February, advising that Conditions to liquor permits in the Port Keats (Wadeye) region, are changing from **1 March 2024**.

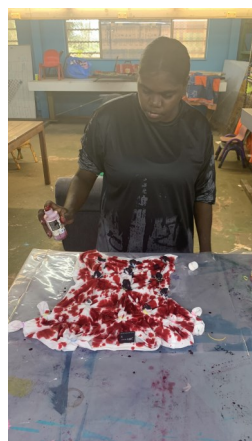
## Women's Centre Fun with Fabric
