NORFORCE Re-Engagement Visit

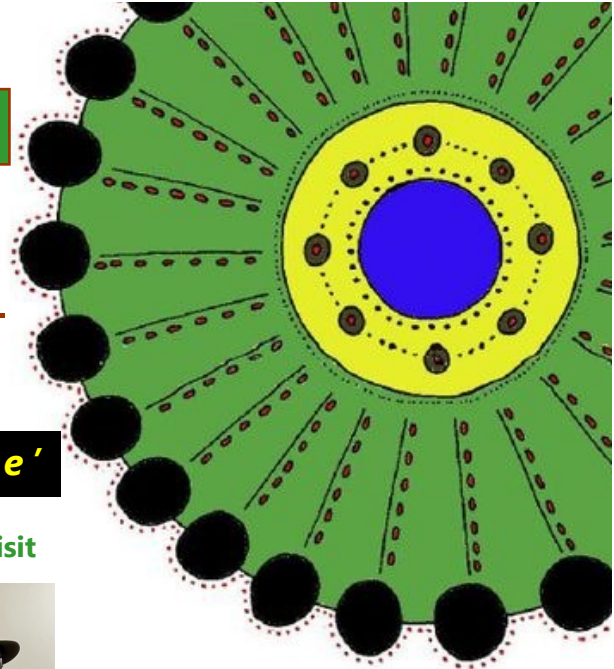

The Palumpa Team have been doing first aid training, preparing them to deal with a range of medical emergencies, from common injuries such as cuts, scrapes, and burns to major injuries such as trauma to the head, impaled objects and cardiac arrest.

It is important to have people in remote locations trained to manage emergency situations.



The training covered CPR, managing breaks and bleeds, impaled objects, poisons, snake bites and burns and all the participants left feeling more confident in managing emergency situations.
