

Outrage at Telstra Outages

Wadeye has faced yet another unplanned Telstra outage this past week, and the frustration in the community is palpable. Since January 2024, the area has endured twenty days of disrupted internet and mobile coverage across five separate outages. While many local businesses have turned to Starlink in recent years to maintain operations, most residents still depend on Telstra for connectivity.

The impact of these outages extends beyond inconvenience. For instance, aged care facilities rely on digital records software that cannot connect to Starlink due to cybersecurity concerns, rendering the service non-compliant during outages and delaying essential updates to client care records. Similarly, the fuel card reader, which also cannot operate on Starlink, limits access to fuel during these connectivity lapses.

Extended connectivity issues unacceptable in urban centers, and they should be equally intolerable in remote communities where reliable connectivity is crucial. The persistent outages highlight a pressing need for improved communication and reliable infrastructure to ensure that remote communities are not left at a disadvantage. TDC has requested an investigation into Telstra services and outages.

TDC Governance, Risk and Compliance Manager Thivanka Silva will be reaching out to local organisations and residents to accurately capture the impacts of these events, and prepare a submission on behalf of the TDC Board.
