This week he was filming activities with the Child and Family Centre to capture the programs run for families and children. The ladies ran a playgroup at the beach to promote fine motor skill development,



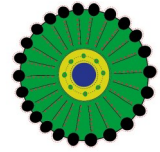
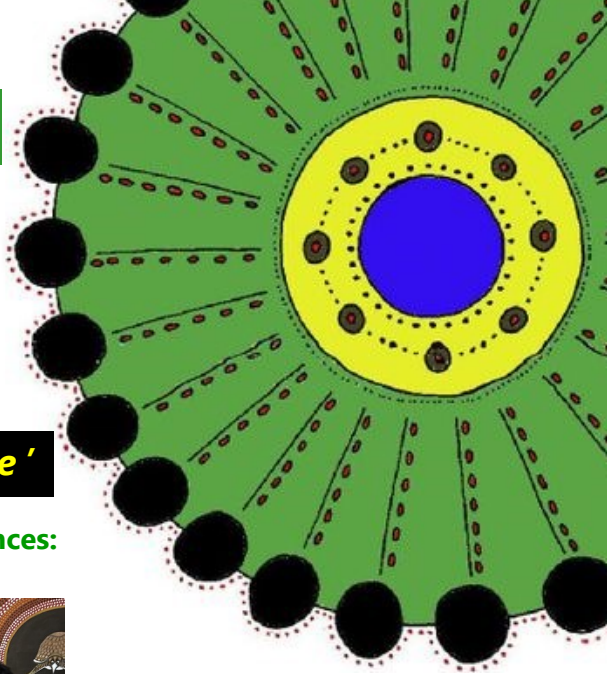
where children played around mixing different coloured sand and made their own artwork. The kids loved being outside and also enjoyed a lesson in videography from Jonno.
